Man sentenced for smuggling endangered black pond turtles



Info.gov.hk, October 3<sup>rd</sup> 2013- A spokesman for the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) said that a 26-year-old man was sentenced at the Tsuen Wan Magistrates' Courts on October 3 to three months' imprisonment for illegal import of endangered species and three months' imprisonment for cruelty to animals. Customs officers intercepted the man who came from Thailand at the arrival hall of the Hong Kong International Airport and seized a total of 338 freshwater turtles from his luggage on October 1. Of them, 335 were black pond turtles. Read More

Hong Kong Customs seizes 769kg of ivory tusks hidden in soya bean containers

**Cninanews.com, October 3<sup>rd</sup> 2013-** The 769kg haul of 189 pieces was hidden in three 20-foot containers labeled as soya beans that came from Ivory Coast,

West Africa, via Malaysia on September 14 and 19. The banned tusks would have fetched HK\$11.5 million (USD2.4 million) on Asia's black market. The haul was discovered after the officers opened the containers. Read More

Six-months imprisonment for illegally processing a pangolin

## Imprisonment for illegal purchase and transportation of pangolin scales

Jxnews.com.cn, October 21<sup>st</sup> 2013- Since July 2012, the suspect Liu has purchased 50kg of pangolin scales from Nigeria with the help of a Chinese worker there. The scales were mailed back to China by express and then sent to Traditional Chinese Medicine markets in Henan and Jiangxi Province for sale. In December 2012, Liu was arrested when coming back to Pingxiang, Jiangxi Province from Baiyun Airport of Guangzhou. On October 20<sup>th</sup> 2013, the Anyuan District Court sentenced Liu to 3 years in jail, probation for 3 years with a fine of CNY50,000 (USD8197) for illegally purchasing and transporting endangered species products. **Read More** 

#### Hefei tried huge ivory smuggling case

**163.com, October 21<sup>st</sup> 2013-** Within 18 months, eight suspects smuggled over 3200kg of ivory tusks, worth CNY 135 million (USD 22 million). ### A Guangxi couple tried for illegally transporting rhino horns

On January 6<sup>th</sup> 2013, according to the intelligence, the couple was arrested when they were trading the 13 rhino horns. Jiangmen Customs seizes over eight tons of frozen pangolins

In the ship, the police discovered 8.1 tons of frozen pangolins, 1.6 ton of pangolin scales, 200 kg of sharkfin and 300 kg of python skins. The total value reached CNY18 million (USD3 million). The pangolins were suspected from Indonesia, and the case is under further investigation. Read More

#### A fishman detained for illegally processing hawksbills

After the further investigation, on October 25<sup>th</sup>, the police detected 227 hawksbill specimens (worth USD 163,934) from the suspect Feng's factory in Jiujipo of

Tanmen. Now, the suspect Feng was detained. Read

10-year imprisonment for illegally transport ivory products

China.com.cn, October 29<sup>th</sup> 2013- In early March, the defendant Li delivered 2 ivory tusks from Zhuhai, Guangdong Province to Beijing by express. In addition, he asked another person Huang to send 168 ivory products from Zhuhai to Beijing by express. On March 10<sup>th</sup>, Li was arrested. Recently, the defendant Li was sentenced to 10 years in jail, deprivation of political right for 2 years, with a fine of CNY20,000 (USD3 175) for illegally transporting endangered species. Read More

#### Shanghai establishes PICE-CG

CITES.gov.cn, October 30<sup>th</sup> 2013- In order to enhance CITES law enforcement cooperation, effectively construct regional enforcement platform and further enhance law enforcement capacity, led by the Shanghai branch of CITES MA, the PICE-CG was officially established in Shanghai on October 29<sup>th</sup>. The first meeting of this group was attended by over 40 participants from Shanghai Forestry Administration, Agriculture Department, Industrial & Commercial Bureau, Public Security Bureau, Shanghai Customs and

### Nanning Customs seizes 17 smuggled hawksbills
