Hong Kong SAR

Hong Kong Customs detects speedboat smuggling case involving about \$14 million







Hong Kong Customs yesterday (June 28) mounted an anti-smuggling operation at Yau Tong industrial area and detected a suspected speedboat smuggling case. A batch of suspected smuggled goods, including red coral, dried fish maws, bird nests, dried shark fins and used mobile phones, with an estimated market value of about \$14 million was seized, and a light goods vehicle suspected to be connected with the case was detained.

Customs officers yesterday evening conducted an anti-smuggling operation at the Yau Tong industrial area and spotted a suspicious speedboat heading towards the seashore of the industrial area with its navigation lights off. Later, several suspicious men on the shore moved a batch of goods onto the speedboat. They were suspected of participating in smuggling activities. The officers then took action and the speedboat fled towards the southern waters of Hong Kong.

Customs officers later seized the batch of suspected smuggled goods in a nearby open space and inside a light goods vehicle. A 41-year-old male driver of the light goods vehicle was arrested.

An investigation is ongoing and the likelihood of further arrests is not ruled out.

Customs stresses that it will keep up its enforcement action and continue to fiercely combat sea smuggling activities through proactive risk management and intelligence-based enforcement strategies, along with mounting targeted anti-smuggling operations at suitable times to land a solid blow against relevant activities.

Smuggling is a serious offence. Under the Import and Export Ordinance, any person found guilty of importing or exporting unmanifested cargo is liable to a maximum fine of \$2 million and imprisonment for seven years.



Hong Kong Customs detects largest smuggling case on record involving goods worth about \$1.5 billion





Hong Kong Customs on June 13 detected a suspected case of an ocean-going vessel being used to smuggle goods to the Mainland via Singapore at the Kwai Tsing Container Terminals. A large batch of suspected smuggled goods, including electronic goods, expensive food ingredients, table wines, music records and scheduled endangered species, with a total estimated market value of about \$1.5 billion was seized. This is the largest smuggling case detected by Customs on record in terms of the seizure value.

Through risk assessment, Customs discovered that criminals may use ocean-going vessels to smuggle goods to the Mainland via Southeast Asian countries, and therefore formulated strategic plans. Fifteen containers, declared as carrying wood pulp, prepared to be shipped to the Mainland via Singapore by an ocean-going vessel, were identified at the Kwai Tsing Container Terminals.

Upon inspection, Customs officers found that the 15 containers were fully packed with wooden boxes. Some of the wooden boxes were used to carry raw paper while most of the wooden boxes were used to conceal suspected smuggled goods. The majority of them were electronic goods, including integrated circuits, printed circuit boards and capacitors, totalling about 1.1 billion pieces. Other goods included about 25 tonnes of expensive food ingredients, about 20 000 bottles of table wines, about 27 000 pieces of classical music CDs and vinyl records, and scheduled endangered species.

After a follow-up investigation, Customs arrested a 45-year-old man suspected to be connected with the case, and detained 15 containers suspected to be involved.

An investigation is ongoing. The arrested man has been released on bail pending further investigation and the likelihood of further arrests is not ruled out.



Customs is the primary agency responsible for the suppression of smuggling activities and has all along been combating various smuggling activities proactively at the forefront. Customs will keep up its enforcement action and continue to fiercely combat sea smuggling activities through proactive risk management and intelligence-based enforcement strategies, along with mounting targeted anti-smuggling operations at suitable times to land a solid blow against relevant activities.

Smuggling is a serious offence. Under the Import and Export Ordinance, any person found guilty of importing or exporting unmanifested cargo is liable to a maximum fine of \$2 million and imprisonment for seven years. Moreover, any person who imports or exports pharmaceutical products and medicines without a valid licence commits an offence. The maximum penalty upon conviction is a fine of \$500,000 and imprisonment for two years.

Under the Protection of Endangered Species of Animals and Plants Ordinance, any person found guilty of importing or exporting an endangered species without a licence is liable to a maximum fine of \$10 million and imprisonment for 10 years.

Hong Kong Customs and AFCD join hands to combat endangered species smuggling activities

Hong Kong Customs and the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) conducted a one-month joint enforcement operation codenamed "Shepherd" in May this year to combat endangered species smuggling activities at the airport, seaport, land boundary and railway control points.

During the operation, Customs detected 24 cases with seizures of about 5.3 tonnes of suspected endangered species with an estimated market value of about \$22 million and arrests of 14 persons. Among the seizures, over 5 tonnes were suspected scheduled dried shark fins of endangered species, with an estimated market value of about \$21 million, seized by Customs inside two imported seaborne containers. Apart from these, other suspected endangered species, including live turtles, dried seahorses and American ginseng were also seized.

"The joint operation was a great success. It is also a vivid demonstration of how the two departments' close cooperation effectively targets the activities of endangered species smuggling," the Group Head (Air Cargo Group) of Airport Command of Customs, Mr Cheung Ka-chung, said in summarising the operation today (June 16) at a joint press conference.



"Facing the endless smuggling tactics, Customs will stay vigilant and strengthen its efforts in intelligence collection and analysis for even more effective enforcement. Similar joint operations will be undertaken," he added.

"As the epidemic gradually levelled off and normal travel between Hong Kong and Mainland has been resumed since February 6, Customs detected 175 cases of suspected smuggling of endangered species in the first five months of this year, which has exceeded 60 per cent of the total number of cases detected last year. This reflects that endangered species smuggling activities had become relatively active recently. Customs and the AFCD will continue to work closely in combating illegal activities involving endangered species on all fronts."

Smuggling is a serious offence. Under the Import and Export Ordinance, any person found guilty of importing or exporting unmanifested cargo is liable to a maximum fine of \$2 million and imprisonment for seven years.

The Endangered Species Protection Officer of the AFCD, Dr Jenny Lau, reminded the public that any person who imports, exports or possesses endangered species not in accordance with the Protection of Endangered Species of Animals and Plants Ordinance will be liable to a maximum fine of \$10 million and imprisonment for 10 years upon conviction, while the relevant items will be confiscated. Members of the public are urged not to break the law.

AFCD busts 50 ivory products in Yau Tsim Mong store



The Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) officers seized 50 suspected elephant ivory products from a shop during a Monday morning operation in the Yau Tsim Mong District.

The AFCD stated that they had previously received a complaint regarding a store in Yau Tsim Mong that was suspected of selling products made from elephant ivory, which is banned in Hong Kong.



The AFCD sent out officers yesterday (Jun 5) to investigate the store and discovered 50 products suspected to be made from elephant ivory, which have been seized for further investigation.

AFCD spokesman states that the government has been committed to the protection of endangered animals and has banned the import, re-export, and commercial possession of elephant ivory, except for antique elephant ivory in Hong Kong, since December 31, 2021.

The AFCD has also warned the public that enticing customers with free ivory or displaying ivory labeled "not for sale" may also violate the Protection of Endangered Species of Animals and Plants Ordinance.

The AFCD stated they would remain in close contact with relevant government departments, including the Customs and Excise Department, to continue combating smuggling and the illegal trade of ivory.
